Rationale for Programme(s)

Action Learning is a dynamic problem-solving method that amplifies learning across individual, organizational, and industry levels. This method is especially effective for complex, 'wicked' problems that are characteristic of today's business landscape - challenges that require innovative, collaborative solutions. This programme aligns with other programmes in the Faculty of Business which has a strong record of delivering action learning oriented and practice-based programmes for industry.
