12.	Rationale for Changes:	The minor amendment to the title, from 'Heritage Studies' to	
		'Heritage' aims to more clearly reflect the programme content and	
		is in line with the terminology used by a number of universities in	
		the United Kingdom who offer programmes of study in the field of	
		heritage. The University of Hertfordshire, for example, runs a	
		Professional Doctorate in Heritage (DHeritage), which 'is aimed at	
		professionals who work in, or desire to work in, the heritage field	
		broadly defined'—a 'dynamic and ever-changing sector crucial to	

		many economies and to local and national identities'. Secondly, the University of Stirling runs an MSc Heritage, which provides students 'with a critically informed, interdisciplinary education in heritage and its place in society, including its conservation and management'. Thirdly, the University of Wales Trinity Saint David runs a Heritage MA, which 'offers students an opportunity to gain an in-depth understanding of heritage from the perspective of different disciplines, including archaeology and history thus, providing valuable insights and an understanding of a sector that is gaining increased significance in today's world'. By retaining the word 'Heritage' in the title of the three undergraduate programmes at GMIT, they will still be playing to the Institute's strengths in the field of heritage. Over the course of more than a quarter of a century, GMIT's niche programmes in this field have attained local, regional, national, and international recognition from students and employers alike. The Institute has also led the way in research in this field in Ireland, as is evident from the track-record of the Heritage Research Group and its predecessors. The Programme Board are confident that 'Heritage' on its own will be sufficiently broad so as to appeal to students who desire a Technological University qualification that will be recognised globally for pursuing a career in the field of heritage	
		and working in either the private or public sector.
